





Information for Trust and Health Board staff: Responding to queries from people completing the National Clinical Audit of Psychosis (NCAP) service-user questionnaire

Your Trust/organisation or Health Board will be contacting a large number of people using your Early Intervention in Psychosis (EIP) services with a questionnaire for the National Clinical Audit of Psychosis (NCAP). In the materials we have produced for people taking part in the audit, this is referred to as the National Audit of EIP services. Your Trust/organisation or Health Board will be asking people for their views on the care they receive. We want you and your colleagues to feel supported throughout this audit process and to feel confident responding to questions about it.
